### AUGUST KRANTI MOVEMENT : INDIA'S JOURNEY TO INDEPENDENCE

The month of August holds significant historical importance for India, particularly due to the August Kranti movement that played a pivotal role in the country's struggle for independence from British colonial rule. Back in 1942, India had been under British rule for nearly 200 years. The dissatisfaction and frustration with British policies had been growing steadily, fueled by economic exploitation, social injustices, and political oppression. During World War II, India's contribution to the war effort was substantial, yet the British administration's disregard for Indian aspirations led to widespread unrest.

The Spark which led to Independence was the Quit India Movement initiated on August 8, 1942, by Mahatma Gandhi with the famous call of "Do or Die." This marked a departure from the nonviolent methods that had previously been employed. Gandhi's call for mass protests and non-cooperation aimed to put intense pressure on the British government to leave India. This Massive Uprising of the movement saw a groundswell of participation from across the country, encompassing people from various walks of life. People joined in the fight for freedom. The British responded with brutal repression, leading to a violent crackdown and numerous arrests, including that of prominent leaders. **ONE SMALL STEP FOR MAN, ONE GIANT LEAP FOR MANKIND**

Chandrayaan-3 was the third Indian lunar exploration mission under the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Chandrayaan programme. It was launched on 14 July 2023. The spacecraft entered lunar orbit on 5 August, and the lander touched down in the lunar South Pole region on 23 August 2023 at 12:32 UTC, making India the fourth country to successfully land on the Moon, and the first to do so near the lunar South Pole. It was a follow-on mission to Chandrayaan-2 to demonstrate end-to-end capability in safe landing and roving on the lunar surface. It consists of Lander and Rover configuration. It has been launched by LVM3 from SDSC SHAR, Sriharikota. The propulsion module had carried the lander and rover configuration till 100 km lunar orbit. The propulsion module had Spectro-polarimetry of Habitable Planet Earth (SHAPE) payload to study the spectral and Polari metric measurements of Earth from the lunar orbit.

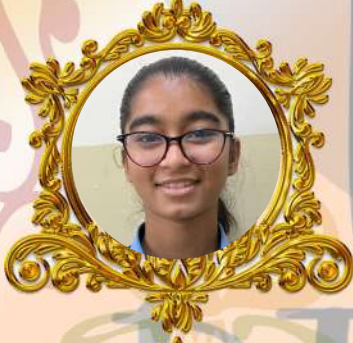
