PARENTING TIPS ON SAFE DIWALI



Celebrating Diwali can be a joyful and festive time for families, but it's important to prioritize safety, especially when children are involved. Here are some parenting tips for a safe Diwali:

- Supervision: Always supervise children during Diwali celebrations, especially when lighting fireworks or candles. Keep a close eye on them to prevent accidents.
