The event was concluded with the award ceremony and the winners were declared. Followed by the vote of thanks by the Asst. Head Girl and a national anthem.





GANESH CHATURTHI



Ganesh Chaturthi, also known as Vinayaka Chaturthi, is one of the most widely celebrated festivals in India, particularly in the states of Maharashtra, Karnataka, Goa, and Andhra Pradesh. 
