
















CHAIRMAN'S CHAMPIONSHIP WEEK

Day 3: Final day and Closing Ceremony


































































PARENT TEACHER MEETING (PTM-4) GRADE I TO GARDE X

PARENTING TIPS ON PREPARING SUCCESS AND FAILURE EQUALLY



Preparing children to handle both success and failure is essential for their emotional resilience and overall well-being. Here are some parenting tips to guide you in teaching your child how to approach both outcomes with balance and perspective:

1. Model a Balanced Perspective -

Show them how you handle successes and failures in your own life. Celebrate achievements without arrogance and acknowledge mistakes without self-pity. - Use failures as opportunities to demonstrate problem-solving and perseverance.

2. Focus on Effort Over Outcome -

Praise their hard work, persistence, and dedication rather than just the result. For example, say, "I'm proud of how much effort you put into studying,"* rather than, *"I'm proud you got an A." - Teach them that both success and failure are part of the learning process.

3. Normalize Failure -

Share stories of well-known people who faced setbacks before achieving success. - Let them see failure as a stepping stone, not an end point.

4. Encourage Healthy Risk-Taking -

Allow them to take on challenges where there's a possibility of both success and failure. - Help them understand that risks are a part of growth and that avoiding failure at all costs can limit their potential.

5. Teach Emotional Regulation -

When they succeed, encourage humility and gratitude rather than overconfidence. - When they fail, validate their feelings, but guide them toward constructive thinking. For instance, ask, "What could you do differently next time?"

6. Celebrate Small Wins -

Recognize and celebrate small achievements to help them build confidence and appreciate progress.

7. Avoid Overprotectiveness -

Resist the urge to shield them from every possible failure. Allow them to experience manageable disappointments to build resilience.

8. Encourage Problem-Solving Skills -

Instead of offering immediate solutions, ask questions that lead them to think critically. For example, What do you think would work better next time?

9. Celebrate Effort, Not Success-

Appreciate our child's effort is easy when it involves a skill that is not a strength for them; but even when our children are very good at something, we should focus on their effort rather than their talent.

If our excitement of having a child with a great talent causes us to praise only their success in that area, we end up overlooking the effort and failures that are behind every achievement. When faced with an obstacle that requires skills that do not come as naturally, our children may be too focused on the outcome to appreciate the effort that comes with improvement.
