## CCA on Tricolor DIY for Grade I to V



“Let us become the reason for their happiness and good lives and not the reason for their extinction.... Save elephants!!!”







# Chandrayan -3

On 23rd August 2023, at 6:04 pm, India scripted history by becoming the first nation to land the Indian Space Research Organisation's Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft on the Moon's south pole. People across the country were glued to television screens and said prayers as the spacecraft approached the surface. This momentous occasion marks a giant leap for India's space exploration journey and highlights the spirit of innovation, determination, and excellence that defines our nation. It marks a significant milestone in India's space journey making it the 4th nation to achieve moon building.

Chandrayaan-3, which means "Mooncraft" in Sanskrit, is a follow-on mission to Chandrayaan-2 to demonstrate end-to-end capability in safe landing and roving on the lunar surface. The lander, Vikram, which means "bravery" and the rover Pragyan meaning "wisdom", is equipped with advanced scientific instruments, to conduct on-site analyses of soil, rocks, and surface features, unravelling the Moon's geological history and shedding light on its evolution. Lessons learned from the earlier mission's challenges have led to advancements in landing technology and navigation systems. These advancements have led to the victorious soft landing on the moon. Chandrayaan-3's success is a tribute to the brilliance of our scientists and engineers, who have worked tirelessly to overcome every challenge, master every complex detail, and turn imagination into reality. This accomplishment is not just a touchdown on the Moon, but a touchdown in history books, a touchdown in the pursuit of knowledge, and a touchdown in showcasing India's prowess on the global stage. Chandrayaan missions have been more than scientific pursuits; they have torched public interest and scientific curiosity.

Vikram Sarabhai had once said "India will not have to look abroad for its experts but will find them ready at hand" and ISRO has proved this today.




