

CCA Competition For Grade VIII to X Topic: Rangoli Making

Bose authored the book ‘The Indian Struggle’ which covers the Indian independence movement from 1920 to 1942. But the book was banned by the British government. He coined the term ‘Jai Hind’. His charisma and powerful personality inspired many people into the freedom struggle and continues to inspire Indians.

Assembly Presentation By Grade IV B Topic: Road Safety




“Road safety is the prevention of road accidents by obeying the road safety rules and regulations.”
