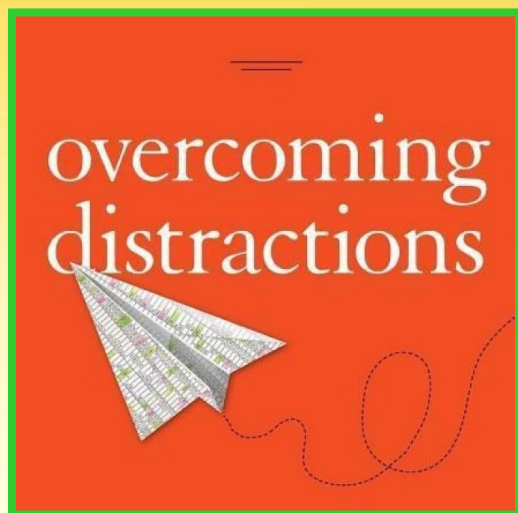
What made the seminar truly special was the emphasis on student participation, where every opinion mattered. The event was attended by students from several other schools, making it a rich learning experience.

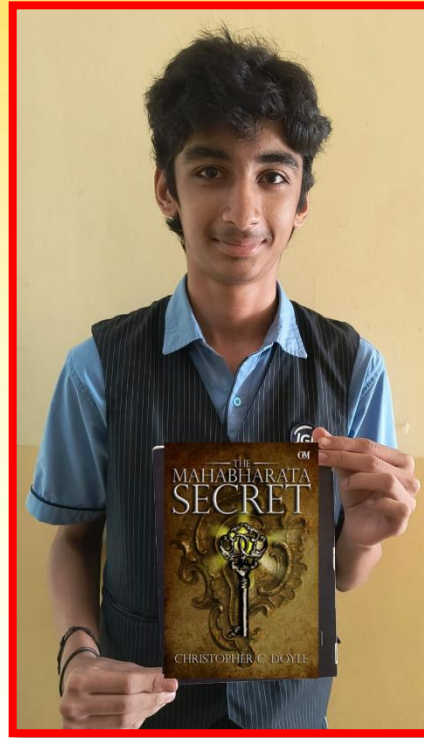

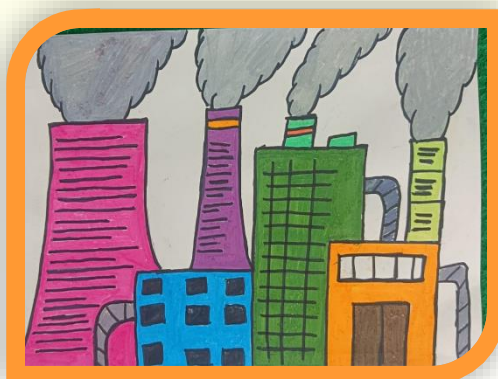

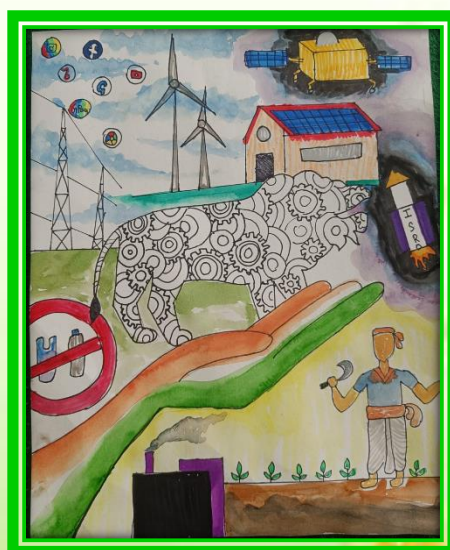
