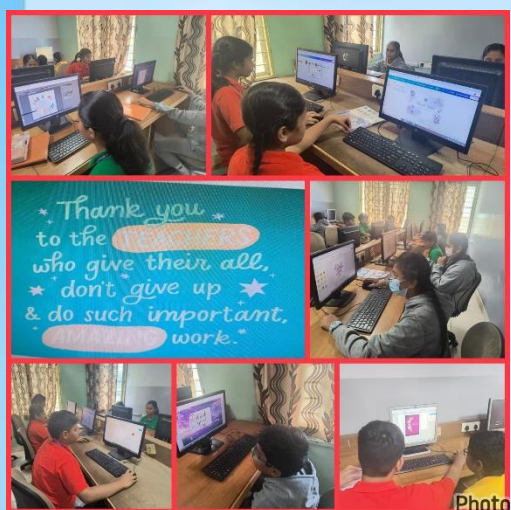

The Salar Jung Museum is an art museum located at Dar-ul-Shifa, on the southern bank of the Musi River in the city of Hyderabad, Telangana, India. It is one of the notable National Museums of India.

We, the students of grade VII of Jain Heritage went on an educational field trip to Salar Jung Museum on 18th November, 2024. After the Nawab died in 1949, the collections were left behind in his ancestral palace Diwan Devdi. The collection was formerly exhibited

there as a private museum, named Salar Jung Museum, which was inaugurated by Jawaharlal Nehru on 16 December 1951. The museum has 38 galleries and we saw all of them. The most interesting point in the museum was the "Musical Clock" which makes a musical note every hour on the hour. We were fascinated by the statue of Veiled Rebecca with its stunning design made with white marble. Everybody liked the firearms and armour gallery. Miniature paintings made on Lord Krishna and Devi Sita. After visiting all the galleries, we had lunch.

As we boarded the bus to return to school, our hearts were full with the memories of a day well spent in the warm embrace of history. Educational trips like this definitely pique our curiosity and motivate us to explore our rich history and tradition.

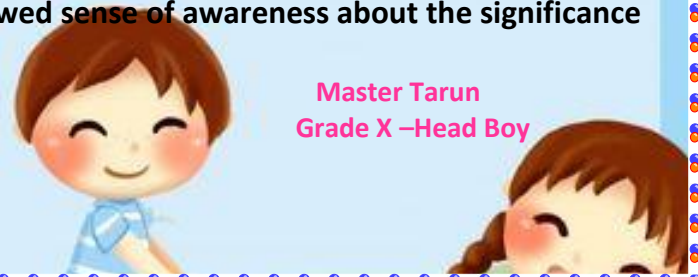

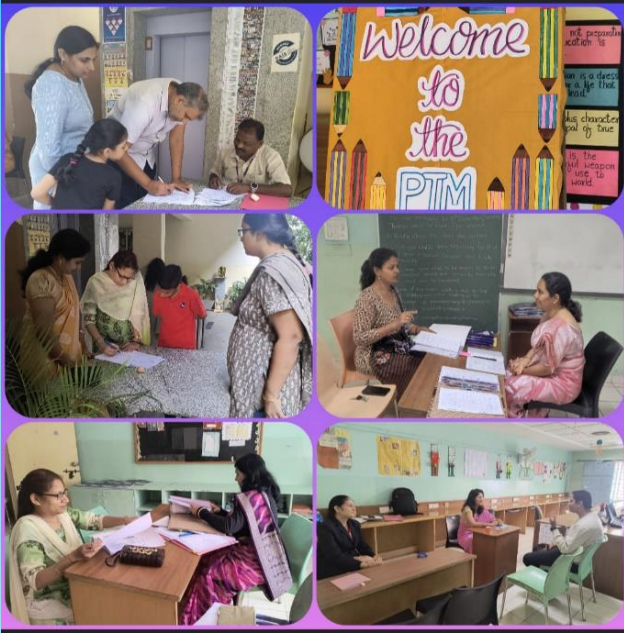
Kumar. Thought for the day by Tanmayi and Word for the day by Naira followed by a beautiful poem by Naadhya.
