**Dussehra Celebrations:** Vijayadashami also known as Dussehra or Navaratri is an important Hindu festival celebrated in Telangana. Vijayadashami, a festival that symbolizes the victory of good over evil, is celebrated with traditional fervor, devotion and gaiety across Telangana. The name Vijayadashami is derived from the Sanskrit terms “Vijaya-dashami” which means victory on the day of Dashami. Dashami is the tenth lunar day of a Hindu calendar month. This festival is celebrated with fervor across all temples of Goddess Durga in the state of Telangana and throughout the country. During Navaratri i.e. nine nights, Goddess Durga is adorned in her different forms and avatars like Mahishasura Mardhini, Bala Tripura Sundari, Raja Rajeshwari, Annapoorna, Kali, Kanaka Durga, Lakshmi, Saraswati and Gayatri Devi. Students usually keep their books and workers clean their tools for the purpose of puja on the ninth day of Navaratri, called Ayudha Puja which are then taken back, after puja on the tenth day i.e. Vijayadashami. Women and children organize ‘bommala koluvu’, which is a special arrangement of dolls and toys, aesthetically accompanied by flowers as well as lamps. Saraswathi Puja is also performed by many Telangana families for initiating their children into education since Vijayadashami is considered highly auspicious for this purpose.



Students recited thought-provoking poems and speeches highlighting the significance of Dussehra. The highlight of the celebration was the energetic Dandiya dance performance, where teachers and students danced together in perfect harmony. The colorful sticks and traditional attire added to the festive atmosphere, filling the air with joy and enthusiasm.

Our respected Principal Dr Mona Mehdi addressed the gathering, emphasizing the importance of these festivals in promoting our rich cultural heritage and values. She encouraged the students to uphold the spirit of unity, courage, and righteousness that these festivals embody.

Beginning in Hyderabad, we reached the airport at 6 am on 3-October highly excited to fly to Delhi and then Nainital, surrounded by breathtaking scenery. We reached NAINITAL around 8.30 PM and checked into our rooms.

We visited Snow Point View, Woodland Waterfall, Eco Cave Garden, and took pleasure in a tranquil boat ride on Nainital Lake the following morning. The lake is reported to have developed like an emerald eye. The temple of Naina Devi is situated near the lake's northernmost point. Naina and the tal (Lake) are thus the origins of the name Nainital. Along with shopping in the neighbouring Tibetan Market and Mall Road, we also went to the Naina Devi Temple. Shopping for lovely jewellery and fragrant candles with the buddies was a lot of fun.



On October 5, we travelled to Jim Corbett and explored the Corbett Tiger Reserve Museum and the Corbett Museum, a historical institution that honours Sir Edwar James Corbett, popularly known as Jim Corbett, and showcases his life and belongings. We went out for a guide tour of bird watching before sunset. We spotted an array of species, including the Red-Wattled Lapwing, Cattle Egret, Kingfisher, Green Bee-Eater, and Great Tit, bathed in the golden twilight light. Our guides also introduced us to intriguing plants like majestic teak trees, jackfruit trees, and demonstrated asexual plant reproduction. This enlightening experience, set against Jim Corbett's breathtaking sunset, brought us up close



and personal with the region's stunning flora and fauna. We went to the Garjiya Devi Temple on the way back to the Resort. To end the day, we enjoyed an exciting and enjoyable DJ night at the resort.



All the students were prepared to experience the early morning safari on October 6 at 4 a.m. A magnificent tiger crossing the road in front of our safari was the rarest of rare sightings, and we were ecstatic to see it. The pleasure, excitement, and chilly experience we all had are hard to put into words! At Jim Corbett National Park, where visitors can enjoy the most exhilarating experiences of these captivating pastimes, tiger

sighting and bird watching go hand in hand.

The next day we checked out and drove to Delhi and on the way visited Craftspeople and artisans from all over the nation come here to exhibit their traditional goods to tourists. ## Educational trip to Subway, SLN Terminus for Grade III & IV



There is a proverb that goes, “I hear and I forget, I see and I remember, I do and I comprehend,” and it refers to the idea that seeing something being done in a certain location helps people remember it better. Educational tours are a crucial component of learning because they give students the chance to learn outside of the classroom and get useful practical experience.

Students of Grade 3 and 4 at JHCS Kondapur, went on an educational field trip to an outlet of the popular American restaurant chain Subway, located at SLN Terminus, Gachibowli. Accompanied by teachers, students boarded the bus at 10 am and reached the outlet after a short bus ride. Though some students

were familiar with the brand and their lip smacking “Subs”, it was their opportunity to take a look behind the scene and understand the journey of a “sub” from the oven to the plate! A friendly Subway employee explained the role of various machines that are used to store, rest, wash and bake the dough for baking fresh breads at Subway as students explored them with wide-eyed wonder. Students learned that every loaf starts frozen and is not ready to bake until thawing and proofing. Any loaf the restaurant makes needs a total time of 10 to 13 hours from freezer to customer. They also learned about the two main varieties of dough that are used to make bread at Subways namely white Italian bread and brown bread with three different types of seasoning.



Next it was time for students to witness how different varieties of sandwich are put together with toppings based on customers’ preferences. They witnessed the making of a few sandwiches, which was an interesting process for them to behold. Finally, Children boarded the bus to return to school filled with interesting stories to tell and memories to cherish.

Through this experience children got an interesting insight into the food industry. They had an opportunity to understand the products, processes and people involved in bringing food to our table. They also picked up some interesting tidbits regarding the Subway brand which was named after the submarine-like shape of the bread they use. All in all it was a memorable trip for the students.
