The workshop included essential knowledge about basic electric connections and safety. connections in electrical systems. They explored the purpose of fuses, which protect circuits from overloads, preventing fires and damage. Also the workshop emphasized on identifying safe electrical practices, like avoiding wet hands while handling electrical devices and never using frayed cords. By fostering this understanding,

students gained confidence in managing household electrical issues, ensuring both their safety and that of

their families, while also promoting responsible use of electricity in daily life. Life skills sessions are crucial as they equip individuals with practical abilities and behaviors that enhance personal and professional development. 

Jain Heritage The Cambridge School Kondapur


