To make the festival colourful, the students dressed in traditional attire. Anchoring was done by Amrutha from grade 6th in Telugu. The program started with a melodious song sung by grade 4 students. Yaswini explained in English how Makar Sankranti is celebrated in various parts of India. The vibrant decor put together painstakingly by teachers and students provided a pleasant backdrop for the entire programme. Students from grade 7th gave a rhythmic dance performance that enhanced the festive

atmosphere. Aaradhya, Joshitha and Hamsika provided information about the festival by presenting an article which helped the students understand its significance. They explained how the festival is observed in various ways and under various names throughout India. Bhogi Pallu is a tradition of showering children with a mix of fruits, flowers, and blessings during the Bhogi festival. The tradition is believed to protect children from evil, bring them prosperity, and bless them with long and healthy lives. Haridasu is a tradition in India that involves people singing and performing in villages and towns during the Sankranti festival. The word "Haridasu" translates to "servant of God. Gangireddu vadu is the master of a decorated bull, or gangireddu, that is paraded around during the Sankranti festival. The gangireddu vadu plays a flute, or nadaswaram, while leading the gangireddu. Students also learned that it is celebrated since it is harvest time, and farmers celebrate by cooking a dish called Pongal with freshly harvested



rice, flying kites, and participating in other sports. They invite family and friends over for feasts while also decorating the front of the house with rangoli.

Such celebrations in the school broaden the cultural horizon of the students and present them with unforgettable memories for a lifetime. They enhance the students' learning experience and help them showcase their talents as well as foster teamwork.

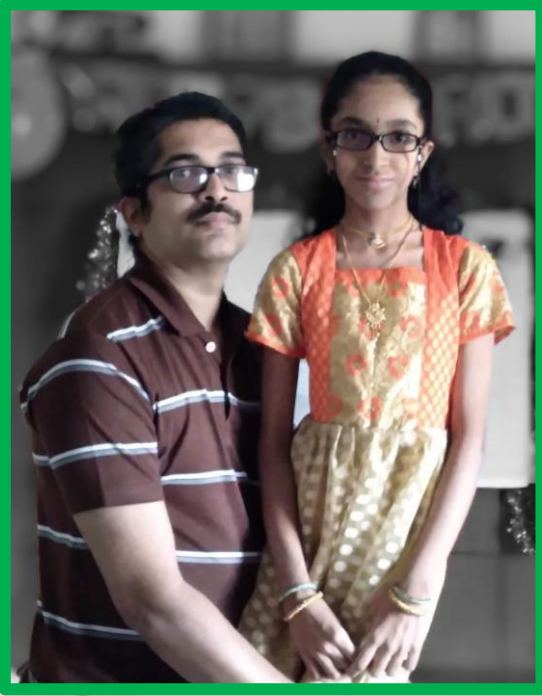

Very informative morning assembly sessions are arranged which are handled by students under teacher's guidance. She is enjoying her school and get motivated by her faculty's curriculum wise.

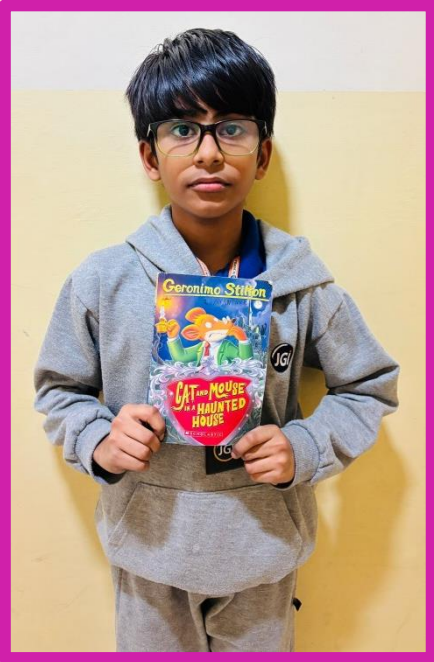

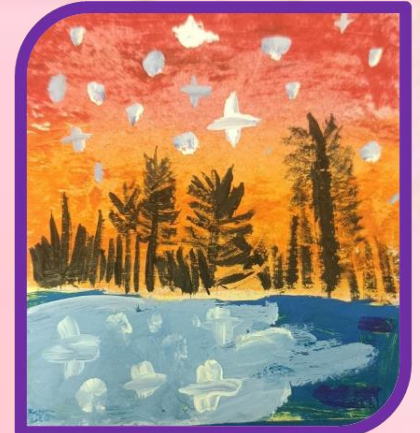
