

Welcome Day @ JHCS Shamirpet – 13 June 2022


Mr.D.C.Prakash was invited as Guest of honour and he explained how children can become great personalities by giving some suggestions.


Writing essay develops essential skills and functions in the education of a student, thereby making them helpful to practice and perfect skills transferable throughout their learning career and into their professional life.






