## **HIROSHIMA DAY**

August 6th marks a somber anniversary - Hiroshima Day - a day that serve as a poignant reminder of the devastating effects of nuclear war. On this day in 1945, the United States dropped an atomic bomb on Hiroshima, Japan, killing an estimated 70,000 to 80,000 people instantly. The bombing, followed by another on Nagasaki three days later, led to Japan's surrender and the end of World War.

The atomic bomb, dubbed "Little Boy," exploded with a force equivalent to 15,000 tons of TNT, leveling a significant portion of the city. The blast and subsequent firestorm destroyed nearly 90% of Hiroshima's buildings, leaving the survivors to face unimaginable horrors. The effects of the bombing were felt for generations, with many of them are still suffering from radiation sickness, cancers, and long-term health issues.

Hiroshima Day serves as a powerful reminder of the importance of promoting peace and nuclear disarmament. The survivors of the bombing, known as hibakusha, have dedicated their lives to share their experiences and advocating for a world without nuclear weapons. Their stories are a testament to the human cost of war and the need for diplomacy and dialogue.

Today, Hiroshima Day is commemorated around the world with ceremonies, memorial services, and peace rallies. In Hiroshima, a bell tolls at 8:15 a.m., the exact time of the bombing, followed by a minute of silence. The city's Peace Memorial Park, built on the site of the bombing, serves as a poignant reminder of the devastating effects of nuclear war.


# **QUIT INDIA DAY**










## **WOMEN EQUALITY DAY**


