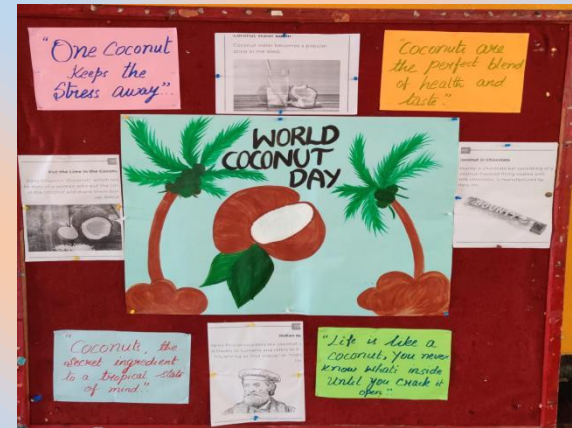
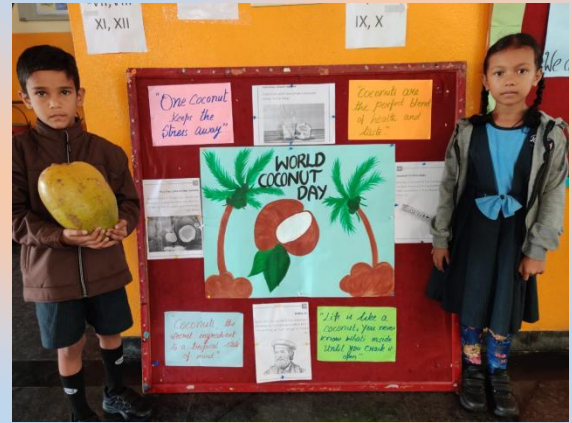
- Cuisine: Coconut milk, oil, and meat are used in various dishes, from savory curries to sweet desserts.

CCA - GANESH MAKING

A Ganesh making competition in school can be a fun and educational activity, especially during the Ganesh Chaturthi festival. Students of grade I to VII participated with great enthusiasm. This event encouraged students to create eco-friendly Ganesh idols using materials like clay, paper, cardboard, or natural items such as leaves and flowers. This helped to promote environmental awareness and sustainability. Ganesh drawing was a great way for students to showcase their artistic skills and celebrate Ganesh Chaturthi. They started with basic shapes to outline Ganesha's head, body, and trunk and paid attention to Ganesha's crown, jewellery, and the mouse. Ganesha is often depicted in bright and vibrant colours. So, students used a mix of reds, yellows and blues. They also included traditional symbols like the lotus, modak (sweet) and the Om symbol. Each student showcased their creativity by designing unique and innovative Ganesh idols and drawings. This included using different colours, textures and decorations.

Teachers helped students to understand cultural importance of the day. Students learned about the significance of Ganesh Chaturthi and the importance of Lord Ganesha in Hindu mythology. Students used clay or play-doh, paints and brushes and decorative items like beads, sequins, and glitter. They also used sculpting tools or simple household items like toothpicks and spoons to make idols.



GANESH CHATURTHI CELEBRATION

Ganesh Chaturthi is a popular Hindu festival celebrating the birth of Lord Ganesha, the elephant-headed god of wisdom, prosperity, and new beginnings. The festival typically lasts 10 days, beginning on the fourth day (Chaturthi) of the Hindu lunar month of Bhadrapada, which usually falls in August or September.

During Ganesh Chaturthi, devotees bring home or visit elaborately decorated idols of Lord Ganesha, performing prayers, singing devotional songs, and offering sweets like modak (Ganesha's favorite). Public pandals (temporary stages) also display large idols, where community prayers and festivities are organized. The festival culminates with the immersion of the idols in rivers, lakes, or the sea, known as Visarjan, symbolizing Ganesha's return to Mount Kailash and the cycle of birth and rebirth.



PARENT-TEACHER MEETING/PLANTATION DRIVE/ACADEMIC FAIR
